

The main feature will be an "oldie but goodie", very entertaining cult comedy

"DIE FEUERZANGENBOWLE"

directed by Helmut Weiss and featuring the beloved Heinz Rühmann in the main role. The title refers to the *Feuerzangenbowle* punch consumed by a group of gentlemen in the opening scene. While exchanging nostalgic stories about their schooldays, the successful young writer Dr. Johannes Pfeiffer realizes he missed out on something because he was taught at home and never attended school. Pfeiffer decides to make up for this lack of experience by masquerading as a student at a small town high school and quickly gains a reputation as a prankster. Together with his classmates, he torments his professors with adolescent mischief. His girlfriend Marion unsuccessfully tries to persuade him to give up his foolish charade. Eventually, he falls in love with the headmaster's daughter and discloses his identity after provoking his teachers into expelling him from school.

The movie was produced and released during the last years of World War II and has been called a "masterpiece of timeless, cheerful escapism". The story is further remarkable in that Rühmann in the role of the undercover student was already 42 years old at that time but was able to play a secondary school student. The transformation of the accomplished writer back to a not-so-innocent schoolboy is an example of the cheerful escapism popular in German films at the end of WWII. The charm of the teachers lies in their old-fashioned attitudes and individual quirks.

Unfortunately, at the last video presentation the announced "Vorspann" did not work out, and we shall therefore show you "G'schichten aus dem Wienerwald" at this date. Vienna is the world's only metropolis with a vast continuous forest area in its immediate vicinity – the Vienna Woods, an area blessed with an unexpected wealth of wildlife. A team of natural history film-makers pursued the wild boars and crawled with the beetles to portray the living Vienna Woods over the period of one year. The other side of the coin is the romantic aspect of this lovely natural forest, where couples of all ages have been for years and years and are still taking their strolls and families make it their destination for week-end picnics and children's games.
